A Message from Pastor Laura

Don't let anyone look down on you because you are young, but set an example for believers in speech, in conduct, in love, in faith, and in purity. - 1 Timothy 4:12



Scholarly estimates suggest that the Biblical pastor, Timothy, was about sixteen years old when he became a preacher. Our preachers on September 12 will be anywhere from fifteen to twenty-eight years old.

The Youth Group and the Young Adults will be sharing about their respective summer mission trips during the September 12 worship service at 10:15 a.m. This will be

called, "Mission Sunday," a time to celebrate the missions of Sunset Hills U.P. Church. It will also be the kick-off for our 2021 Stewardship Season, under the direction of Elder and Treasurer Mary Abbott.

Beginning with the Youth Group, we will hear about their mission service in Benton Harbor, Michigan. Deacon Jennifer Kennedy and Drew Kennedy served as chaperones as the youth performed manual labor and cared for the least of these in this underserved community. This trip was in cooperation with the youth group of Bower Hills Community Church.

The Young Adults will then speak about their week in Wilmington, North Carolina with Habitat for Humanity. Six of our twenty-somethings drove south to do repair work on a home, including putting siding on a house. In their words, "Wilmington learned what SHUP is about!" as they worked up a sweat every day in Christian service.

Finally, following worship, there will be an opportunity to continue our mission work through writing letters and cards to local representatives. We will be advocating for local immigrants to be able to receive a driver's license prior to receiving citizenship. In partnership with Bower Hill Community Church, we are advocating on behalf of this cause so that our Mt. Lebanon streets may be safer, particularly for our children who walk to school.

So, come and hear some young people tell us about Christ's work this summer! Let us hear them preach the word, and be inspired by their awesome, mission-filled example to continue making a difference for God's kingdom ourselves!


Fall Festival Bake Sale

Mission Updates

Driving is such an essential part of basic mobility that most of us take it for granted. Many of us see no risk in simply getting in our cars and driving to a doctor's appointment or to pick up groceries for our families. The right to free mobility, however, is not afforded to our undocumented immigrant population. In Pennsylvania, proof of legal residency is required for a driver's license.

The policy is problematic in multiple ways. First, it makes it difficult for immigrant families to freely navigate their day-to-day activities and chores, secure employment, and provide for their families. Second, it hurts our state economy by making it difficult for r undocumented immigrants to fill jobs for which they have the appropriate skills that might otherwise go unfilled. The undocumented immigrant population makes an important

contribution to our economy and could make an even greater one if these residents were allowed access to driver's licenses. Third, allowing undocumented immigrants to secure driver's licenses would lead to safer streets and more insured drivers, which would reduce auto insurance costs. Finally, expanding access to driver's licenses would not only be free for the state, but it would lead to increased state revenue from both the sales taxes on auto-related purchases and driver's license processing fees.

In the last few years, more states have realized the benefit of giving residents access to driver's licenses regardless of their immigration status.

Driving PA Forward Letter Writing Campaign

"Driving PA Forward" needs vocal advocates across the state and seeks the endorsement of communities of faith who believe that all people are entitled to fair treatment and access to work. On April 14, 2021, on a motion from our Mission Commission, our Session authorized an overture to Pittsburgh Presbytery to join them in supporting PA House Bill #2835 (currently HB279) that permits individuals without social security numbers to apply for a driver's license using other official documents.

<u>The Mission Commission would like you to join them after worship on September 12th</u> to help write letters to our local and state representatives asking them to vote "yes" to HB279. We believe HB279 will truly make or roads safer, have a positive economic impact for our state and provide safety to our families and communities.

After many years of service as the Director of Sunset Hills Nursery School, Christine Huber has taken an early retirement. Although she will be missed, we wish her the best! Fortunately, we did not have to look far to find someone who could fill her shoes!

Michelle Brumfield has been hired as the Director of the Sunset Hills Nursery school. Many of you may already know Michelle and her husband Dave. They have been members of SHUP since 2001. She has also been working at the preschool since 2006.



#### Q & A With Michelle Brumfield

Is there a particular reason you chose SHUP as your church?

Dave and I chose SHUP as our church because of the warm, friendly welcome we received the first time we came to service. Dottie Wolf greeted us that first visit and made us feel like we were home. We had been looking for a community church to raise our children in and were lucky enough to find it right up the street.

When did you start working at the nursery school and what positions have you held?

I worked as a substitute in the preschool for the 2006-2007 school year. I was hired as a Teacher's Assistant in the 5-Year-Old PreK class in 2007 and have held that position for 14 years.

Have there been any special moments/memories from your years at SHUP and/or working at the NS?

<u>Nursey School</u> - I have loved getting to know the amazing women who work here at the preschool. We have had "sleepover" team building sessions, ukulele lessons, secret Santa weeks, March Madness weeks, not to mention all day continuing education seminars (where we may have laughed a little too much). We are like a family. We have all bonded together over our love of children and this preschool.

<u>SHUP</u> – Some of my fondest memories of SHUP involve ringing handbells both at church and at local festivals. Jessica's baptism was a wonderful day where I was able to share my church with my family from out of town. #### Fraudulent Emails/Spear Phishing

#### What is Spear Phishing?

Spear-phishing, are personalized messages from scammers posing as people or institutions that you trust. The information these scammers use to contact you are often collected from social media or other websites. They will create a fake email address in the name of a person/institution, then they send "urgent" email messages to that person/institution's contact list. The emails will often request that you provide personal information or to send money/gift cards.

#### Here at SHUP

Recently, someone has been using our website to do a little spear phishing. They have been creating a fake email address under Pastor Laura's name and sending messages to members of our church.

The email messages make it sound as if it is an "urgent" matter and that Pastor Laura needs "your help." The messages will request that you only contact her by responding to that email and not to call her because she is in a meeting.

Unfortunately, some who have received this email have responded. They are then asked to purchase gift cards and to send pictures of these gift cards (the codes on back) to the email. Fortunately, no one has actually sent the pictures and only some have purchased the gift cards. Please remember that Pastor Laura and no one you know should ever request that you to send them money in this manner. So, if you see an email like this that looks like it is from Pastor Laura, delete it immediately.

#### Youth Mission Trip to Benton Harbor, MI Love Your Neighbors - But Not Just the People Who Live Next Door

Learning about our Neighbors was the theme for our mission week this summer. The parable of the Good Samaritan was where we started. In Luke 10:27 it says "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind"; and, "Love your neighbor as yourself". Jesus told his followers to love God and as part of loving God, to love neighbors. Jesus shared a vision for love and service that navigates past fear and stereotypes to create a path between people who need to be loved. The youth were challenged to practice seeing the God-given value in each other, and to allow their compassion to grow into action. Our week in July and beyond, Jesus was inviting the youth to travel that path towards being a neighbor



with the people they encountered along their way. The youth then put these into action by volunteering at a mosaic retail store that supports the community with transitional job training, mentoring, giveback and leadership development; at a food bank where in one afternoon they packed 300 boxes of food for the senior community; at a personal residence where our neighbor could not complete physical tasks such as weeding and painting to keep beauty and pride in their home and at a cultural center where individuals care and have pride in their community and want to make it more appealing to the residents but were unable to complete these laborious jobs alone. The youth of SHUP not only rose to the challenges of being good neighbors, they did so with hard work, generosity, compassion and smiles. They made us proud.



## Sunset Hills Book Club July Book of the Month Aug. 26th - 7:30 pm The Seven Storey Mountain (Part 3) By Thomas Merton




