A Message from Pastor Laura

Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord.
- Luke 2:11



The gift of Christmas is time. And, if you're anything like me, time is typically something Christmas has taken away. I found myself at Christmas parties with people I didn't know well, making small talk that left my spirit drained. I would spend eons in lines at Target when all I'd done was run in for some socks...and somehow walked out with a full buggy. I felt my time always being eaten in December until I woke up on January 2 wondering where the time with my loved ones had gone.

With most everything being cancelled or moved online this year, we get the time back in 2020. We can watch our favorite Christmas movies, bake our favorite Christmas cookies, and slip on our fuzzy slippers to linger over Facetime calls with our family - all without conjuring the courage to drive under nightfall. Additionally, we have the time to savor the Christmas story.

We are receiving two ways of savoring the Christmas story with our time this year. The first is in the form of a devotional written by my dad, the Rev. Dr. Clint Cottrell, and me. Our devotional is entitled *In the Bleak Midwinter*, based on the hymn of the same name. This devotional recognizes the grief that we have carried throughout this past year, and the darkness of our winter. But, it moves beyond the grief to the light that we find in Jesus Christ. We have aimed to create a devotional that is hopeful, spiritually fulfilling, and sometimes challenging as we seek to be faithful to our God in Christ this Christmas.

Second, we are savoring the Christmas story with the 8:00 a.m. adult Sunday School class entitled *Incarnation*. This study uses videos from Methodist pastor, Adam Hamilton, to reflect on the reality of God dwelling among us in the person of Jesus the Christ. We will reflect on the Bible together in this class, even as we reflect on what this story means for our lives.

I hope you will receive the gift of time this Christmas season. Let your fists loosen from their grip on all that needs to be done, that your hands may be opened to receive all God's gifts that are near.

Music Notes

Flexibility . . . my, how we've all had to learn that ability during this season of pandemic!

My article was all written and ready to go for the December Messenger . . . and then another "Stay At Home Advisory" was announced. Which means that our in-person worship plans have changed (and will continue to evolve over the course of the Advent Season).

My hope throughout this season is that the Campanile Bell Choir will be able to offer to the congregation the beautiful music that we've been working so hard on – whether it will be to share it in-person or to record it for our YouTube services. We'll also be presenting some Advent and Christmas anthems that were sung by our Chancel Choir and recorded from previous years. We ask your patience with us as we juggle our musical plans for the season!

One thing that's a definite is a new and exciting project that we'll be sharing with the congregation as Christmas approaches. It's a concert called "*The Virtual Singing Christmas Tree.*" Many of you have heard me talk about the composer Joseph Martin as one of my favorite anthem composers. While he was "grounded" this year from his usually-busy travel schedule, he got an inspiration:

"We started The Virtual Singing Christmas Tree to be an encouragement to choir programs that have been impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. Many churches and community choirs are not able to meet in person and we wanted to provide creative options for singers everywhere. Soon, we began to dream beyond just doing a traditional virtual choir experience. We reached out to some of the nation's leading musicians to join our efforts and, before long, we had a

concert, 'The Virtual Singing Christmas Tree; a gathering of hope, a concert of joy.' This event was born of a desire to share the music of the season in a joyful new way. The Virtual Singing Christmas Tree will be the centerpiece of this amazing Christmas concert, while our guest Christmas magic to complete our evening of ministry, artistry, and community. This is an exciting new Christmas event that connects singers everywhere through the joy of music. Some of the nation's finest inspirational artists and ensembles are partnering to create a concert of hope and light." (Joseph Martin)

Singers from around the country (and the world!) have been invited to participate in the virtual singing Christmas tree anthems, and seven of our own SHUP Chancel Choir members will be part of the choir. The final musical selection of the concert will be Joseph Martin's original composition of "Let There Be Christmas." Be sure to watch for Ryan Gracey, Shelby Gracey, Dave Petty, Sarajane Obarsky, Tori Vernacchio, Keith Yanda, and Michelle Yanda (live from California!) to be part of that anthem. In addition to the virtual anthems and the guest artists, this hour-long concert will also include the Milwaukee Handbell Choir, and a virtual children's choir. Our participation in the event allows us to share the entire concert through our SHUP website, Facebook, and other social media platforms, so you'll all be able to watch the full concert in the comfort of your own homes. (You can also share it freely with your family, friends, and neighbors!) Our plans at this point are to share the final song of the concert in worship for our Christmas Eve service (either in-person or virtually).

The organization that is doing all the



technical work for the project is currently working on editing the videos and mixing every submission to combine it with the hundreds of participant submissions. Once the final product is completed, the anthem will be placed into the concert and surrounded by the music of some of the finest vocal artists and musicians from around the country.

Your Mission Tithe and Dedicated Mission dollars have been at work during October and November. Your Mission Commission allocated an additional \$250 to SHIM because of increasing needs in our communities. The greater Presbyterian church received \$250 for GIVE828 which supports scholarships for seminary students of color. Pobatso, the young African whom we support through World Vision, received a 4th quarter installment to complete \$280 for 2020.

We participated in a series of 4 lectures through the Pittsburgh Theological Seminary on “Race and God’s Mission.” These lectures were viewed and discussed by a “watch group,” the Wednesday Night Bible Study. The focus of the lectures was recognizing systemic racism in our churches and personal lives, as well as missions we engage in. The Seminary is offering 6 workshops on racism for individual congregations.

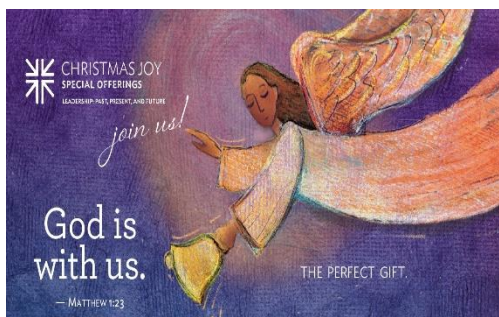

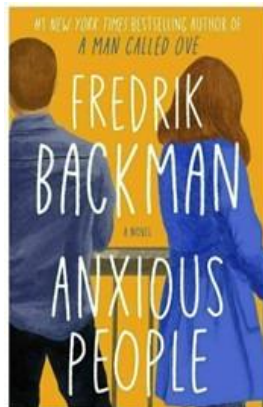

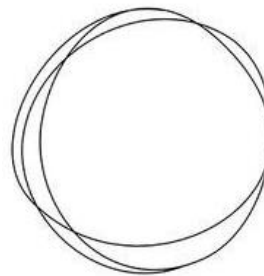
***Anxious People* by
Fredrik Backman**



An everyday apartment open house becomes the stage for Backman's latest novel, when a bank robber bursts in and takes a group of strangers hostage. As the title hints, each member of the group bares his or her own anxieties, not just about the hostage situation, but about their individual lives. Backman is a funny, charming story teller, and "Anxious People" is a fine showcase for his talents as a writer. There are twists and surprises. There are editorial asides. Beneath it all, there is a deep sense of warmth and empathy. Backman is particularly gifted at creating a community of memorable characters and opening up their mental states to readers. And many readers of Anxious People will in turn reflect on their own anxieties. Ultimately, Backman seems to be telling us that—though it be a messy, ambiguous world we inhabit—we can turn toward one another to find calm and assurance. This is a novel that can, and should, be embraced by anxious people everywhere. —Chris Schlupe, Amazon Book Review

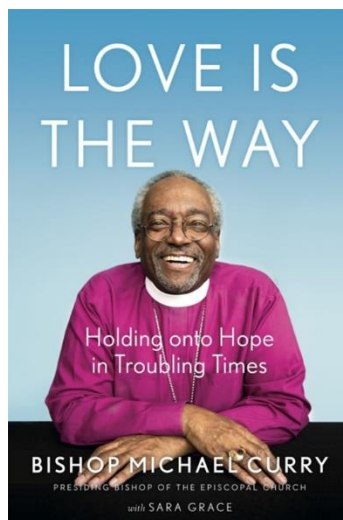
